International Friendship Centre

Since the IFC opened up again, after being closed for two years because of Covid, there have been some changes. The war in Ukraine has affected that of course and we have the challenge, and the privilege, of welcoming refugees from Ukraine into our church group. Many of our former participants have not returned, probably because their circumstances have changed during the break, but we still see one or two of our 'regulars'. At the moment we are feeling our way and I personally am very grateful for the support that has been forthcoming. People from our church and others have been so willing to share time, talents and ideas and resources which has been very helpful and a real blessing.

We meet on a Monday from 12 noon until 1.30 pm and we are trialling a second session from 2-3 pm, with the intention of giving people opportunity to engage in more practical activities, but so far this session has not taken off. Today (20th June) we had nine visitors, one Polish, six Ukrainians and one 'supporter' who stayed from 12 until 2pm. We will go with the flow and change our way of doing things as we find out what people's needs are. Because of the influx of refugees there are many other groups starting up in the area to meet people's practical needs and give them opportunities to meet with the organisations and individuals who can help them. Finding hosts to give Ukrainians homes continues to be a high priority of course and so is learning English. The IFC has become part of that wider network of support rather than functioning only as an independent group as before.

The Pathways Centre at the Hinckley Baptist Church runs a Friday morning session for Ukrainians and those who support them. This has been very helpful and Karen and I visit it regularly to meet up with people, find out who's who and who does what, and talk to the Ukrainians who come along to find the help they need. Please pray for the Friendship Centre and for the wider mission to refugees and immigrants wherever they may come from. Pray for all those who need help, give thanks for all those who offer help and support, and pray for opportunities to bring them closer to God and His love.

and all the stars obey.*



In reflection on the message from Sunday 22nd May 2022,

Bible Readings: Acts 2:1-4 & Acts 2: 42-47

The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost & The Fellowship of Believers

John 15:5-17 *I am the Vine, You are the Branches*

The Sermon reflected philosophically on how God's creation progresses eternally, onward from Christ coming, bringing his Holy Spirit to guide us, always, as our lives develop. Perhaps we each have a favourite hymn this guidance brings, which recalls God's love for us, for example, in the beauty of his creation and the bounty it brings to our lives. Our lives are shaped through joys such as the springtime, but there are sorrows too, but the Spirit's guidance overcomes them through God's amazing grace. So "Amazing Grace" was the final hymn and expresses our lives, into eternity.

In reflection on the message for Sunday 29th May 2022

Call to Worship from Psalm 150. **Praise the LORD.
Praise God in His Sanctuary.**

Old Testament Reading: Numbers 10:1-9 *The Silver Trumpets.*

New Testament Reading: 1 Peter 2:5-10 *The Living Stones.*

Sermon:(**series: Part 6**): **"Do not neglect your Priestly duties."** In Part 5 on Easter Sunday, it was noted that Jesus becomes the **Great High Priest** to whom we have access. So Peter can write, **"...you (like living stones) are a royal priesthood."** With Christ as the cornerstone, it is the Priestly duty of each one of us, according to our abilities, to serve God righteously, joining together in praise and prayer, ministering to the needs of others and each other, and proclaiming the love of God for all, knowing that through our service, God (see OT reading) will remember us.

In reflection on the message for Pentecost Sunday 5th June 2022

Call to Worship: words from Luke 24, v49: *Jesus said, "I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with the power from on high."*

Reading: Romans 8: 14-17 *Life Through the Spirit.*

Sermon: "**Tarry ye in Jerusalem,**" (said Jesus to his disciples Luke 24, v49.) to await empowerment by the Holy Spirit. In the OT, Israel's God is the Father, now we have the beginning of the Christian Church and God becomes the Three-In-One, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is vital that we receive the Holy Spirit in our hearts, to empower us and give us confidence to serve God as his children (Romans 8, v16/17), and by carrying out our Priestly duties (see last Sunday's sermon).

In reflection on the message from Sunday 12th June 2022,
Trinity Sunday

The Bible Reading was from John 1: 1-18 *The Word Became Flesh.*

Message: **The Trinity. God in Three Persons.** The **Father** was the Creator. In Genesis 1, v3, we read "**The Word**": **And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. God saw that the light was good.** John the Baptist, in our reading, was introducing **Jesus** as "**The light that shines in the darkness... and so ...The Word Became Flesh.**" At Pentecost, the third person of the **Three-in-One**, the **Holy Spirit** was sent by God to be our comforter and our guide, to bring the **light** of God and Jesus to reside in our hearts and our lives.

In reflection on the message for Sunday 19th June 2022

Call to Worship: words from Psalm 23

Before we get to the Book of Esther Chapter 4, it helps to have "**The story so far**". In Ch.1, we introduce King Xerxes, ruler of 127 provinces from India to Cush and his wife Queen Vashi. After much partying and showing

off his domain to his cronies, he bids his attendants to (v 11) *to bring before him Queen Vashi, wearing her royal crown, in order to display her beauty to the peoples, for she was lovely to look at.* Vashi refused to come. The king was advised (v 19f) *to give her royal position to someone else.* And the king issued an edict; *all women will obey their husbands.* In Ch. 2, the king looks for a new queen from a cast of many! Esther was one of these. She was an orphan who had been adopted by the Jew, Mordecai, enslaved to Babylon.

Her Jewish background was not revealed to the king. Esther was the winner of his favour and became The Queen replacing Vashi. Mordecai Uncoveres a Conspiracy; two of the king's officers conspired to kill the king and Mordecai discovered the plot and told Esther who told the king, who was grateful to Mordecai. In Ch.3, there is a Plot to Destroy the Jews. The king's favourite, Haman, was honoured by other nobles who were expected to kneel to him, but Mordecai would not, because he was a Jew. Haman found out and planned to kill not only Mordecai by all the Jews. Haman tried to bribe the king to do this, but the king said keep your money and do as you please. Haman sent an edict, in the king's name, to the 127 provinces with instructions to annihilate all the Jews.

So, to our reading from Esther 4: 1-17 **Mordecai Persuades Esther to help,**

We have to read on to discover the outcome. **The story continues.** In Ch.5, Esther put on her royal robes and stood before the king. When he saw Queen Esther, he was pleased and held out his gold sceptre that was in his hand. So Esther approached and touched the tip of the sceptre. The King asked, "What is it Queen Esther? What is your request?"

You will have to read on to find out what happened to the Jews. **But Queen Esther was strategically placed** to do her bit for the Jews and God.

Sermon: **You are strategically placed** to do your bit for God.
God has a task for each of us, however big or small.
We can turn to God in prayer when we need help.
