Letter From our Minister

God is always is the business of doing new things in the lives of the people that are called according to God's purposes and plans in Jesus Christ our Lord. The challenge for many of us is seeing that, acknowledge and embracing it. We sometimes expect God to work among us as God has done before and have a tendency to think that the past was always better (Nostalgia) than today and end up missing what God is doing among us today.

Isaiah reminded God's people in captivity to know that God was still among them and was working in a new way and they should be careful not to miss that. Isaiah 43:18-19 "Do not remember the former things nor consider the things of old. 19 See, I will do a new thing, now it shall spring forth; shall you not be aware of it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert".

In the past, God, through the prophet Isaiah warns His chosen people, the nation of Israel, that He was going to punish them for their unfaithfulness towards Him. He will cause them to be defeated and taken captive by their enemies, and they will be exiles in a foreign land away from home for many years. In this text, God is again speaking to His people concerning a new thing that He is going to do for them. In other words, things will change in the future. No, they will no longer be the same because God is including them in His future plans.

Today, God is sending forth a promise of hope that can only be received when we choose to let go of the past, reach forward and receive that which He has now has in store for us. Just like the children of Israel, we too have a choice. We could meditate on our past, or we could gaze our focus upon what God has promised, and desire to do in and through our lives now and in the future.

How will we respond to God's promise concerning our future? Will we believe by faith and cooperate with Him?

Let go and forget the past in order to receive the promise! Is this where you are mentally and spiritually today?

We are looking help at both events plus donations of Mince Pies.



Recalling the Ministry for September - October 2022



In reflection on the message for Sunday 25th September 2022

The two readings each consisted of
a Prophesy followed by a "Story" and then a further Prophesy.
Initially, a reflection and preparation was given of the first reading:
Extracts from Jeremiah 32: 1-3a & 6-15 Jeremiah Buys a Field.

Jerusalem was being besieged by the Babylonians. Jeremiah <u>prophesied</u> that they would capture the city. King Zedekiah was cross and imprisoned him. Jeremiah lawfully arranged for a field to be bought at Anathoth. Jeremiah <u>prophesied</u> about (a long time in the future) that:

v15: For this is what the LORD Almighty the God of Israel, says: 'Houses, fields and vineyards will again be bought in this land.' This would be for their eventual return from captivity in Babylon and rebuilding Jerusalem

Extracts from Luke 16: 19-31 The Rich Man and Lazarus

Clearly the rich man had not loved his neighbour. Jesus concludes his parable (referring to his own death) in v31 (see below). **Reflection on this reading:** was Jesus describing the truth (a <u>prophesy</u>) of what actually happens at death? His concluding reference to <u>his</u> forthcoming death was in verse 31: the rich **will not be convinced** (about heaven?) **even if someone rises from the dead.** This <u>prophecy</u> of <u>his</u> future was like Jeremiah's <u>prophesy</u> that Jerusalem would eventually be rebuilt.

Call to Worship, Psalm 100

Call to Worship, Psalm 100

v1: Shout for joy to the LORD all the earth.

Harvest Gifts were presented and the choir sang "Look at the World." Extracts from Ruth 2:1-20 were read from the dramatized Bible.

Naomi and her husband and sons of the Elimelek clan moved from Judah to Moab to avoid a famine. Ruth, a Moabite, was the wife of one of the

sons. By Ch. 2., Naomi's husband and sons had died. Naomi and Ruth, her daughter-in-law, both widows, travelled back to Judah.

Ruth Meets Boaz in the Grain Field

There was a children's address and the reading above was a drama acted by children and adults.

Sermon – Concern for the Marginalised.

Sermon contexts arising from the reading: Harvest and Racial Discrimination.

The world's resources should be shared amongst all. People such as white people, males, rich people, etc., should not consider themselves privileged. All should stand up for the marginalised, such as the poor, hungry and weak, other races and ethnicities, and campaign without prejudice to bring their lives to the better place they deserve. As Christ taught us, love our neighbours as ourselves.

In reflection on the message for Sunday 9th October 2022

Extracts from Matthew 4:18-25 Fishers of Men.

So, Jesus had called his first four disciples and Jesus Heals the Sick.

A modern-day parable was suggested that: In Jesus we are in Safe Hands

Message: Why did Jesus pick fishermen to be his disciples? And why did they **immediately follow** him? The answers are in earlier parts of the Gospel stories. After his Baptism by John the Baptist, Jesus went from Nazareth to Capernaum, which was by the lake, in Galilee (v 12f) and **Begins to Preach.** In Luke Ch.4 v31f, we have v38, Jesus went to the home of Simon and healed his mother-in-law. So, the new disciples **followed** because of his previous teaching, preaching and healing. See also Mark Ch.1.

How can the disciples meet Jesus' objectives for them (eg **The Great Commission**: Matthew Ch.28. v16f, and the deeds reported in **The Acts**)? The answer is that Jesus, after his Death on the Cross, left them **The Holy Spirit**, as their strength and guidance **for doing God's Will, by preaching Peace and Love**.

In reflection on the message for <u>Sunday16th October 2022.</u> Call to Worship, Psalm 119: 103-104.

How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!

I gain understanding from your precepts; therefore I hate every wrong path.

Extracts from <u>2 Timothy 3:14 – 4:5</u> A Charge to Timothy Extracts from <u>Luke 18:1-8</u> The parable of the Persistent Widow

Address – **Prayer and Faith** – which go hand-in-hand.

The message explained how the Parable in Luke tells that praying to God continuously (v1: not giving up) brings God's response (v8: with justice and quickly). We know that God's response to our prayers does not always provide exactly the response that we expect. However, if we express our prayers with humility, our faith can show us how God's justice is guiding us. Praying the Lord's Prayer provides a way of helping us to pray daily, because it includes many of the main topics we need to pray about. To them we can add the more personal matters we want to pray about. Before **Communion**, we watched a vocal video "The Table of Grace" which welcomed all.
