Minister's letter November 2023

Greeting to you and your families and friends in the name of the one who has called us to be “fishers of women and men” Matthew 4:19.

Jesus calls us to follow Him as the first priority, but Jesus calls us also to be in the business of reaching out to our fellow human beings and sharing the good news of His love for all peoples. We are called to this mission of “fishing people” with the assurance that we are not going to be on our own but we will always have the Holy Spirit working alongside us. God is aware of worries of being not up to the job of “fishing people” and has sent the Holy Spirit to comfort us, teach us, strengthening us for the challenge. I find that helpful to know that God has provided a teammate (Companion) to work alongside us who is God the Holy Spirit.

Our role is to share our experiences with God with the people we meet and make them aware of the love of God for all people. It is important for us to plant a seed of the good news in the hearts of people we interact with and the Lord will water and cause germination to happen. Sometimes God calls another person to water later on. We may not know what would happen to seeds we plant but God knows. We need to just do our part of planting seeds of good news into the hearts of people. We need to encourage ourselves to be in the habit of reminding ourselves of our role to “fish people” so that when opportunities arise for us to share the good news, we will be aware.

We each have different capabilities of fishing. Some are good at one on one, while some are called to attract big crowds but that does not make any capability better than another. We cannot ignore our mandate to fish people as long as we are following Jesus. We need not postpone this calling to share the good news with people as we go by doing our day-to-day business. Let us pray continuously that we will be able to recognise opportunities to share the good news when they arise.

The harvest (Fish) is plentiful but there is a shortage of labourers (Matthew 9:37-38); would you join in with the Lord of harvest with your net or fishing line?

PREPARING THE WAY

The advent period is always an excellent time to share the Gospel and, perhaps, invite others to church. Many unchurched recognise that Christmas is far too commercialised and are more open to the true meaning of the Word becoming flesh than any other time. The challenge for us as a church is to seize the God-given opportunity to engage with people while we are in the longer queues at the supermarket or interacting with younger ones filled with the excitement of receiving gifts. This year we will be posting Christmas cards through some of the households close to church and, as a personal touch, we will be asking everyone to sign several of them (possibly with a short message too if preferred).

As the nights draw in our minds also turn to those sleeping rough or sofa-surfing. While there is provision at other organisations, we should also be prepared to provide for those in need where we cannot refer people on. To this end, we are equipping 4 backpacks (named Matthew, Mark, Luke & John) containing essential and useful items for people without a stable place to stay (toiletries, torch, Bible, etc). The box for these collections will be in the corridor near the side entrance. Please take the time to view the list and see if you can contribute, ideally from items tucked away at the back of your cupboards. We are also asking people to sign up to purchase Hinckley URC branded water bottles, profits from this will go to the provision of bottles for the backpacks.

I will be in the States with Kate from 24th October to 8th November. This trip involves speaking in churches, Christian groups & at a Christian university in Tennessee about our churches' future outreach to young people in the Hinckley area. The focus of the trip is to establish a sports ministry structure for American student-missionaries to visit us for short periods next year & beyond to share the Gospel with young people in our community through sports activities. Please pray for this work to be blessed and that we see its fruit next year.
