## Minister's Letter July August 2023

I marvel at how God sees us Christians as expressed by Paul's letter to the Ephesians Church. Paul addresses the Church as the Saints and faithful who are at Ephesus (Ephesians 1:1). Paul is writing to the existing Church and calls them saints and faithful. I would like to believe that is how God sees us as Church, in particular Hinckley. We may not view ourselves as that, or may not be viewed by others as that or view others as that. But that is how God views us in Christ Jesus.

We may be accustomed to confine the word "saint" to persons who tower above their counterparts in holiness and manifest godliness and devoutness. The New Testament never does anything like that but regards all true believers in Jesus Christ as being, therein and thereby, saints. The word at bottom simply signifies separation. Whatever is separated from a mass for a specific purpose would be called, if it were a thing, 'holy.' But there is one special kind of separation which makes a person a saint, and that is separation to God, for His uses, in obedience to His commandment, that He may employ" the called out" which the Church, as He will. We have been called out to belong to God and for Holy use. We have been made "saints" through our faith in Jesus Christ. We may feel not worthy to be called saints but we through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour.

We are the faithful of God in Jesus Christ. The word "faithful" (Ephesians 1:1) here is not used in the sense of "trustworthy" or in the sense of "fidelity" as it is often employed, but in the sense of "believing" or "having faith" in the Lord Jesus. The apostle addresses those who were firm in the faith - another name for true Christians. We are the faithful of God because of our faith in the one who was, is, and will be, He who knew no sin, Jesus was made to be sin on our behalf, so that in Christ Jesus we might become the righteousness of God (2Corinthians 5:21).

We are who God's word says we are. The Covenant we have with God in Christ Jesus is dependent on the faithfulness of God. "I am convinced and confident of this very thing, that God who has begun a good work in you will continue to perfect and complete it until the day of Christ" (Philippians 1:6)

## News from Hinckley Area Foodbank June 2023

---

Dear Friends,

We would like to say thank you to everyone who has supported us over the difficult times we have all experienced in the last few years.

7177 emergency food parcels were given out last year; that's 64,593 meals. 1/3 of these went to children under the age of 16.

In the last financial year, 2022-23, we saw a significant increase in people using Hinckley Area Foodbank. We saw a 32% increase in people compared with a 37% increase nationally during the year. You can find see

With this increase in demand, we are constantly looking for donations to keep pace with the need. If you can help by putting a tin or packet in the collection bins we have in churches or at supermarkets, we would be very grateful.

Our most wanted items list includes:

- Cereals 13-16 portions
- Tinned tomatoes
- Tinned vegetables, all sizes
- Tinned fruit, all sizes
- Tinned or instant custard
- Tinned meat
- Tinned fish, all sizes
- UHT or dried milk
- UHT juice or squash
- Shampoo
- Male and female deodorant
- Nappies sizes 4,5 and 6

In the last financial year, food banks in the Trussell Trust network have seen the highest ever level of need, distributing close to 3 million (2,986,203) emergency food parcels — including more than a million to children. This is the most parcels the network has ever distributed in a single year.

Our social security system should support anyone in need of help, but right now it's not providing enough income to cover the cost of life's essentials, with most people at food banks in receipt of Universal Credit.

We're calling on the UK government for an 'Essentials Guarantee' to make sure that the basic rate of Universal Credit is at least enough to afford the essentials we all need, such as food, household bills and travel costs.

Today's Reading is from John 17, v20-26. Jesus Prays for All Believers.

Sermon: The Ascension Prayer. In the highly pastoral prayer, Jesus is aware of the difficulties the disciples will have after his going and prays for God to help. The Holy Spirit is being sent to help them so they will keep confidence to continue to preach Christ-Crucified to the world. Jesus prays that the Love and Power he receives from the Father will be passed on to the disciples (inherited by them) and so to all believers, who, down the ages, will jointly inherit Christian Love and Forgiveness. Knowing how much we matter to God, as individuals, in our Church and how much we are Loved by God, we can show the Love of Jesus to people we meet in our lives.

Address: It is obvious that the disciples did not understand the resurrection events. When Jesus appeared to them, he was able to calm their troubled minds, reminding them of His teachings that the Scriptures prophesied that the Messiah would come, and rise on the third day. He asked them to stay in Jerusalem because His Holy Spirit would come to empower them, including for the forgiveness of sins. So the reading from Acts 2, in which they witnessed the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, they were strengthened in their faith and confidence to stand-up-for-Jesus in their task ahead. The power of His Spirit in them was clearly impressing the folk from the many countries who had come to the Festival in Jerusalem.

A Certificate for Golden Ordination was presented, by Rev Geoffrey Clarke, The Moderator of the East Midlands Synod, to Rev Malcolm Clarke, who was previously minister of this church for many years.

In reflection on the message for Sunday 11 th June 2023  
The Service began with a welcome “May the Lord be with you”. A repeated blessing (sung) “Peace to you”. And a Psalm.

Extracts from John 14, v23-31, God’s Love and Peace.

Sermon “Peace.”. We often give “going-away presents” as a sign of friendship. This is what Jesus is doing in the reading. The disciples were unhappy that Jesus was leaving – they did not understand why. In v27, “Do not be troubled,” Jesus said, “Peace I give you.” It was Jesus’ “Bequest” to them (a word we would use in our wills). “Peace” is Christ’s special gift to all who believe in him, delivered by the Holy Spirit (v26).

To people who are non-believers, peace simply means lack of conflicts (wars). This ignores the peace Jesus promises his followers which is shared in our Christian Church families. Jesus’ peace is personal as well as global. (“Beyond all understanding.”)
