COMMUNITY MISSION UPDATE

The cross-church work with young people in our community over August went very well. We take a small break until October half term as we look to recruit more volunteers and purchase appropriate equipment for this work.

Linked to this we will also be partnering with Hinckley & Bosworth Borough Council on a weekly street chaplaincy in November. Again, we are seeking volunteers to share the work. Anyone interested in volunteering should speak with Paul W. Though we ask everyone to pray for this work.





We are proud to be partnering with you at Hinckley URC and believe that you are fulfilling God's command in Isaiah 58 to:

".... loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke.... to share your food with the hungry and provide the poor wanderer with shelter."

We work with you, as well as churches, other to house people in danger of experiencing homelessness, offering temporary supported housing where the tenants can have a safe place to live, find their feet and help get prepared to move on with strategies in place to for a successful future tenancy. As you may be aware, the first two tenants at Janet Jones House have moved on.

We hoped that they would be moving on to their own accommodation. having engaged with the help from Lynith, their Empowerment Worker, amazing support and the friendship offered by Carol, Karen, Sue and Lesley as the Friendship and Support team. Sadly, both of the tenants chose to go down a different path that meant that they were no longer eligible for a tenancy at the house. We thank God that you had the opportunity to show God's love and grace to them. Our measure of success is for the church to be active in loving the homeless and for tenants to experience that love and this has certainly been the case over the last few months. Who knows what seeds were planted or shoots were nurtured through their time at the house.

We will continue to hold these two up to God in prayer and look forward to working with you to provide housing for the next tenants who God brings our way.

following letter to businesses in

"We appreciate these are challenging times for those not born in the United Kingdom. Some are flying the England and national flag (Union Flag) for reasons other than harmless patriotism.

On behalf of our churches, we thank you for your service to the town of Hinckley and assure you that you are valued members of this community.

We encourage you to take a moment to look at these flags and find hope in them. People filled with hate and fear will often mis-use symbols and flags. The cross symbolising the ultimate act of loving sacrifice by Jesus Christ lies at the heart of the flag, whether the England or national flag.
