Church Secretary's report 2025 (part 1)

2025 has been different in the sense that we have been without a minister since Andrew, Candid and Tavonga left to start a new life and ministry in Colchester. A coach load of us went to Andrew's induction service on 15th February. We have missed them but we have carried on, supported each other, got on with the practicalities of running the church and have been actively seeking God's will for us in the future. When people have asked me about the possibilities of us having a new minister I have generally said, "Don't hold your breath". The Synod has made us aware of the shortage of ministers in the URC as a whole and also, which is probably more significant, the low number of applicants for the ministry. There has to be a change in the way that support for the churches is organised. We have to put this situation in God's hands, keep praying and move on which so far I think we have been doing very well. During the years that Andrew has been with us we have been more connected with the Synod and have benefited from their support and encouragement.

Paul's ministry as our outreach worker, along with the support of Kate has also been a blessing and given us more confidence. Their recent move into the vacant manse will not only give them more space but will enable them to be much more involved in day-to-day contact with local people and events. We are indebted too to Rachel, who leads family ministry and works closely with the Council in organising events. The challenge of engaging in mission and sharing our faith with others have been high on our agenda for some time and we have also been more aware of the need to encourage spiritual growth and provide support for those who are 'seeking'.

In November last year I had the opportunity of going on a course with Paul to explore 'Leading your church into growth' (Lycig). It was intensive and helpful and a great opportunity for meeting other Christians with the same desire to learn and be inspired. As a follow-up from this our elders joined with the minister and members of Groby URC to explore how Lycig can be applied in the context of our local churches. Led by Derek Graham and Tom Donoghue we have enjoyed seven follow-up sessions together during the year and have encouraged our respective congregations to share in this.

We looked at the 4 'P's' - Prayer, Presence, Proclamation and Persuasion, which were the topics considered on the course, and explored how each of our churches are doing with respect to these and how we might make positive changes. Prayer is key to everything we do. We need to pray for growth for our church at every opportunity in addition to other prayers.

Church Secretary's report 2025 (part 2)

Presence is all about creating and building relationships through caring for people both in our congregation and in the wider community. We do well at that but we need to be conscious of what we are doing and what we can do better. The Thursday drop-in is a good example of this - it has gone from strength to strength since it started. So is the Hope into Action project. Thank you to the teams who put so much time and effort and prayer into this work. We thank Karen for her leadership in Hope into Action – she is moving away and we wish her God's blessing.

Proclamation is all about presenting or sharing the clear Good News of the basic Gospel message to those with whom we have already established real and caring contact. We need to work on this. It is a priority challenge for 2026 and the upcoming Stepwise course will be a real step in the right direction. Persuasion is the next step – to help those who are interested in, or responding to, the good news of Jesus to find out more.

Again, this will be a target for 2026 and we are hoping to provide some kind of enquirer's group. Julie has volunteered to lead a group for this purpose. Thank you Julie. Paul's ministry as our Outreach Worker and also that of Rachel as Family Worker are key to all these areas of encouraging church growth and we thank them for this most sincerely. But we must not forget to play our part in supporting and encouraging them and owning the work they do. They will both be giving their own reports of the work that they are engaged in and are planning for the coming year. Please pray and talk to them about what they are doing and how you can best support them. How are we getting on with plans to renovate the area around Steptoe's yard? Well, as you probably realise it has been slow going and somewhat frustrating. We want our buildings to be fit for purpose and in good order but it costs money. It is also a big step of faith. We have to trust God that our efforts in doing all the above to support the growth our church fellowship will be fruitful. Hopefully our way ahead as we walk with God will become clearer in 2026. Thank you to all those who are helping to make this happen. Again, please pray. Because we have been without a minister this year our Sunday worship has been led by a variety of different preachers and we have enjoyed a high standard of Sunday ministry. The downside of this is the lack of continuity and ability for forward planning to address our particular needs. The worship team have played a key role in organising pulpit supply and we thank them for their hard work and we are grateful too for those in our own congregation who have stepped in to lead worship. We have also been able to continue to support the Wednesday-at-One services with the help of Sally's husband Charles.

Church Secretary's report 2025 (part 3)

We are very grateful to him for this but we need to find someone else to take on the organising of preachers as Charles is relinquishing this role. We thank David for his dedication to maintaining a high standard of music in worship, leading the choir and helping to organise the choir festival in Coventry cathedral in October. Our elders, including me as church secretary, have had to take on more responsibility for running the church, and Sally, as our treasurer has been challenged with trying to balance our finances. There are many others who work hard to support the church activities: the Safeguarding team, Rob, who looks after the garden, the church website and does other jobs like clearing the old kitchen in Steptoe's yard. Jobs which often go unnoticed. We thank those who organise the Tuesday event, the teams who take on Sunday stewarding, preparing tea and coffee, visiting people and providing flowers and support for them. Maintaining the church buildings is another important role which is overseen by the Fabric & Finance team. Much of the practical work and liaising with professionals is done by Tony and by anyone else he can co-opt to help him out, go up ladders, unblock toilets, prepare the screen input into Sunday worship, step in with projection during services We thank him and those who help him for all the time and effort that goes into this. As we move into 2026 please pray. Give thanks to God for being with us and for all that he has given us. Pray for his continued presence and guidance as we move forward. Pray for the faith, courage and inspiration to reach out to others to tell them about the love of Jesus, and pray for the future of our congregation and our buildings here in this place. We are living in a world which is becoming increasingly unsettled and needs the Christian message of hope, love and forgiveness.

So, we light the lights, we set the table and fill our glasses, and celebrate with friends and family, in defiance of pain and darkness, because we are alive, and love and joy are real.

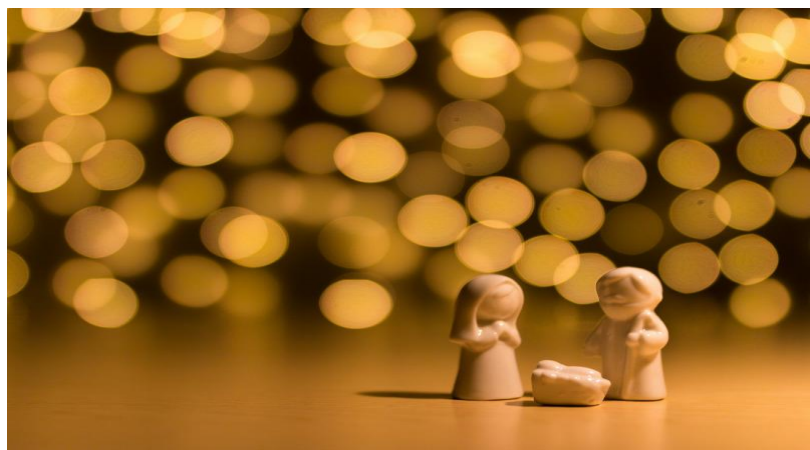
The church chose this time to celebrate the birth of Jesus..

Charles Leggat will be stepping away from arranging the Wednesday at One speakers at the end of December. We thank him for his service and hope to continue to see him when other commitments allow.

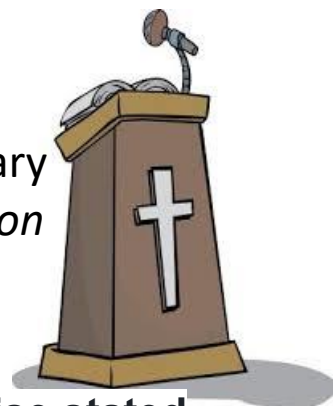
